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THEME

High School, College and University students in the DFW Metroplex area are cordially invited to participate in our Annual Art Contest hosted by the Dialogue Institute Dallas. This contest encourages students to showcase their creativity through original works of art centered around the profound theme of "**The Art of Living Together.**"

This contest theme invites students to explore the ways in which their art can promote harmony, peace and mutual understanding. We encourage students to reflect their unique experiences and perspectives in their "Art of Living Together" submission.

Subtopics for the "Art of Living Together" include, but are not limited to:

- **Embracing Diversity and Cultural Harmony:** Showcasing the beauty of cultures coexisting peacefully, celebrating our differences, and finding common ground.
- **Advocating for Justice and Peace:** Standing up for fairness, equal opportunities, and human rights while promoting peaceful ways to resolve conflicts.
- **Uniting through Inclusion and Gender Equality:** Illustrating how unity can thrive in spite of differences, emphasizing the inclusion of people from all walks of life and highlighting the empowerment of all genders.
- **Becoming Global Citizens:** Encouraging students to think about their role as responsible global citizens while discovering the importance of education in building bridges of understanding through shared cultural moments.

This global and humanistic theme encompasses various fields of study, including but not limited to:

To explore the theme of living in harmony, high students can use various artistic forms such as painting, drawing, photography, digital art, and video to express empathy, tolerance, and cooperation. Additionally, philosophical concepts related to coexistence, ethics, and the human experience can be studied, along with historical examples of cultural interactions that shape our understanding of unity. Through investigating the dynamics of diverse societies and the

significance of unity, participants can bring this theme to life through theatrical performances, drama, and other performing arts.

In addition to promoting global citizenship, this Contest is co-curricular and adheres to national educational curriculum standards, specifically the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). See Appendix A.

RULES

DRAWING/PAINTING CATEGORY RULES

- Submissions in the Drawing and Painting category can be created using any two-dimensional medium, including the following subcategories: Drawing, Painting, Collage, and Graphic Design.
- Students are limited to a single entry, regardless of medium.
- Every submission must include the following information:
 - Student's full name
 - Grade
 - School
 - City
 - State
 - Sponsoring teacher's name (High school Only)
 - Sponsoring teacher's email address (High school Only)
- Submissions that do not include the above information may be disqualified. The online submission form will prompt you to provide these details and offer instructions for uploading your artwork.
- *ALL ART SUBMISSIONS MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE* at www.artcontestdfw.org. Please register your artwork well before the deadline to allow for any potential technical issues.
- All submissions must be physically received in our office **no later than February 20, 2023**.
- Winning art pieces become the property of Dialogue Institute Dallas and may be used, copied, and displayed by Dialogue Institute Dallas for promotional and informational purposes.
- Artwork from non-winning students will be returned upon request after the Awards Reception. Please provide a detailed return address on the back of each submission and include postage and

packaging for the return of each piece. Non-winning students relinquish all claims to submitted pieces on a date to be determined.

- Please be aware that Dialogue Institute Dallas reserves the right to withhold recognition of winners in any category should the submissions in that category not meet the quality standards determined by our professional judges.

General guidelines for all art submissions EXCEPT Graphic Design:

Traditional media categories include *Drawing, Painting, and Collage*. Original work must be 16” x 20” which in turn needs to be *mounted or executed* (not matted) on an illustration board of equal size (black in color if possible). The artwork will extend to the edges of the illustration board. All images must be two-dimensional, original, and not appropriated from any other resource unless dramatically altered. Artwork must be unpublished and completed by one person. The artwork submitted must be your own original concept and not a copy of anyone else's copyrighted material, and it must be personally created by you. Before shipping your artwork (or drop-off) you must first complete a submission form at www.artcontestdfw.org/submission (select your category and level) and receive a code. The instructions to use the code will be emailed to you when you complete the form.

General guidelines for Graphic Design submissions:

Graphic design is defined as using computer media and innovative computer applications in art. Original artwork must be 8.5”x11” only and must be mounted on an illustration board that is also 8.5”x11”. Please only mount the piece on an illustration board that is the aforementioned size. All images must be two-dimensional, original, and not appropriated from any other resource unless dramatically altered. Artwork must be unpublished and completed by one person. The artwork submitted must be your own original concept and not a copy of anyone else's copyrighted material, and it must be personally created by you. This means using AI to generate the artwork is not allowed and would result in your disqualification. Before shipping your artwork (or drop-off) you must first complete a submission form at www.artcontestdfw.org/submission (select your category and level) and receive a code. The instructions to use the code will be emailed to you when you complete the form.

DISQUALIFYING FACTORS: Artwork may be automatically disqualified or receive lower scores if it lacks the aforementioned criteria. Please follow the exact directions for each submission.

*Submissions that do not include the required information may be disqualified. The online submission form will prompt you to provide these details and offer instructions for photograph uploading.

- **ALL PHOTOGRAPHY SUBMISSIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE** at www.artcontestdfw.org/submission. Please ensure you submit your photograph well before the deadline to allow for any potential technical issues.
- Winning photographs become the property of Dialogue Institute Dallas and may be used, copied, and displayed by Dialogue Institute Dallas for promotional and informational purposes.
- Photography from non-winning students will be returned upon request after the Awards Ceremony. Please provide a detailed return address on the back of each submission and include postage and packaging for the return of each piece. Non-winning students relinquish all claims to submitted photographs on a date to be determined.
- Please note that Dialogue Institute Dallas reserves the right to withhold recognition of winners in the Photography category should the submissions not meet the quality standards determined by our professional judges.

Photography work includes color and black & white works. Please do not frame and do not mount photography submissions. All images must be two-dimensional, original, and not appropriated from any other resource unless dramatically altered. Artwork must be unpublished and completed by one person.

VIDEO CATEGORY RULES

Video Contest Guidelines

- **Submission:** Every submission must include the following information:
 - Student's full name
 - Grade
 - School
 - City
 - State
 - Sponsoring teacher's name (High school Only)
 - Sponsoring teacher's email address (High school Only)
- **Content:** Your video should effectively communicate and focus on the contest theme, “The Art of Living Together”, delivering a clear and compelling message. Make sure your content is appropriate for all audiences.
- **Video Length:** Videos should be a minimum of 1 minute and a maximum of 2.5 minutes. Keep your video concise and engaging.
- **Originality:** We encourage creativity and originality. Avoid using copyrighted material without proper permission.
- **Production Quality:** Pay attention to production quality. Ensure that your video has clear audio, smooth transitions, and well-composed shots. Keep shaky footage or background noise to a minimum.
- **Impact:** Aim to create a video that leaves an impact on the viewer. Whether it evokes emotions or provokes thought, your video should have a lasting impression.
- **Ownership:** By submitting your video, you grant Dialogue Institute Dallas the right to use, copy, and display your video for promotional and informational purposes.
- **Entry Limit:** Each participant or team may submit only one video entry.
- **Eligibility:** The contest is open to high school students, college students. Please ensure you meet the eligibility requirements.
- **Judging Process:** Videos will be judged based on the provided rubric, and winners will be selected based on their scores.
- **Submission:** To submit your video, visit artcontestdfw.org/submission.
- **Submission Format:** Videos must be submitted in **.MP4**, **.MKV**, or **.MOV** and are at most **256MB** in size. Ensure that your video is of sufficient quality for viewing. To submit your video, visit artcontestdfw.org/submission
